If you have photos that are taken at a site and with residents or patients, make sure to have a signed authorization to accompany your photos. have the site's approval as well as the patient's or guardian's permission.

Hospice Patients — Volunteer Opportunity

As Katz writes, a visit with terminally ill patients is a great and compassionate gift.

"Izzy and I have visited a number of patients by now, and the hospice people are right: It's sad to see somebody die. But it doesn't have to be depressing. Sometimes it can be beautiful, quite powerful, especially when the people are comfortable and cared for, and have a sense of control."

And for many people, our canines offer that sense of comfort and control.

SLATE: A Interesting Site for Ideas on Life, Animals & Whatever Comes to Mind

One of our volunteers, Chris Williams, sends us links to various online magazines that have dog- and animal-articles. One magazine he frequents is SLATE to see what Jon Katz, a regular contributor has written about his farm in New England, and in particular its animals.

Katz has also written several books about human beings' relationship with animals, one of which is *The New Work of Dogs* (2003). Some of his opinions have ruffled the feathers of his readers, often serious sheepherders that breed and train dogs for their sheep-herding skills.

While Katz is not an animal behaviorist, nor has credentials in the field, he does have some insightful ideas about the role animals play in our lives. In January, he posted "A Patient's Best Friend," a moving account of his experiences with Izzy (a rescued Border Collie) and people in Hospice care. In an excerpt from the article, Katz writes,

"I don't really know why Izzy brings peace and pleasure to people in their final days and hours. There is little research about this kind of interaction, and I prefer to keep it a mystery. Maybe the people are remembering the dogs they loved as children. Perhaps the gentle touch is what matters, what gets through.

"Whatever the reason, I see the same thing over and over. People startle, then smile, and the tension drains. They grow

more peaceful, feel safer. There are some things experts and studies can't explain, even in our sound-bite-obsessed culture."

Several PFH teams volunteer for Napa Valley Hospice and it takes only few weeks for them to finish their requirements. The rewards are truly life-changing. Like Katz, our volunteers have their own moving stories about how their dogs eased patients toward their deaths.
